We ask that all items of uniform be clearly named.

Reception Boys & Girls (Reception children do not wear the formal uniform, but rather a school tracksuit which is more comfortable and practical for free play. In the hot weather, girls may wear the school summer dress if they prefer and boys the school green PE shorts)

- Green tracksuit with school logo (regulation from the school uniform suppliers)
- White polo shirt with school logo (regulation from the school uniform suppliers)
- (Optional) White roll-neck top for colder days (available from the school uniform suppliers)
- Sturdy shoes or trainers (for health & safety, children cannot wear crocs or open sandals)
- Long hair must be tied back and all hair accessories should be green or maroon

Boys' Kippah and Tzitzit

We are proud to be a Jewish school. Boys wear a Kippah and Tzitzit in school.

- Maroon kippah (available to purchase from the school uniform shop or school office)
- White Tzitzit (available from the school uniform shop and most Jewish Book Shops)

Winter: Girls Y1 – Y6

- Y1 to Y3: Green Pinafore (regulation from the school uniform suppliers)
- Y3 – Y6: Green knee length, kick-pleat skirt (regulation from the school uniform suppliers)
Y3 girls can choose to wear either a skirt or pinafore.
- Green cardigan with school logo (regulation from the school uniform suppliers)
- White polo shirt with school logo (regulation from the school uniform suppliers)
- (Optional) White roll-neck top if preferred on colder days, available from school uniform shop
- White socks, maroon tights or bottle green tights
- Black shoes or navy shoes (no trainers)
- **Plain** black boots if preferred in cold weather
- Long hair must be tied back and all hair accessories should be green or maroon.

Winter: Boys Y1 – Y6

- Grey trousers (purpose-made as school uniform trousers)
- Green sweater V neck with school logo (regulation from the school uniform suppliers)
- White polo shirt with school logo (regulation from the school uniform suppliers)
- (Optional) White roll-neck top if preferred on colder days (available from the school uniform suppliers)
- Grey or black socks
- Black or navy shoes (no trainers)
- **Plain** black boots if preferred in cold weather

Summer – Girls Y1 –Y6

- Y1-Y4: Regulation green/white striped dress (regulation from school uniform suppliers)
- Y5 & Y6: school white polo shirt with logo, together with regulation bottle green skirt
- White socks
- Black or navy shoes (no trainers, open sandals or crocs for reasons of Health & Safety)
- Long hair must be tied back and all hair accessories should be green or maroon

Summer – Boys Y1 –Y6

- Grey shorts or grey trousers (designed as school uniform shorts or trousers)
- White polo shirt with school logo (regulation from the school uniform suppliers)
- Grey or black socks
- Black or navy shoes (no trainers, no open sandals or crocs for reasons of Health & Safety)

ALL CHILDREN

- Warm, waterproof coat with a hood, preferably a bright colour for staying safe
- Any colour gloves, scarf and warm hat / balaclava for the cold weather
- Regulation maroon sun hat with school logo (for hot days and school trips). Children's school caps are stored in school in order to be readily available when required.
- R-Y2: Regulation maroon school book bag (**not** a rucksack)
- Y3-Y6: medium-sized rucksack (any colour)
For safeguarding purposes, we recommend that parents do NOT name the outside of the rucksack, but rather name it on the inside. Children may wish to 'personalise' their rucksack for example with a key ring that makes it quickly identifiable as theirs.
- (optional) Reversible, waterproof green fleece jacket with school logo

SPORTSWEAR – (Y1 –Y6)

- Green tracksuit with school logo (regulation from the school uniform suppliers)
- Maroon round neck T shirt with school logo (from the school uniform suppliers)
- Regulation green shorts, (green skirts if girls prefer) (from the school uniform suppliers)
- Trainers or plimsolls (any colour)
- Green PE bag (Please note that Uniform 4 Kids can add name labels onto PE bags in the shop if parents wish, for a small cost.)
- Girls should ensure they keep a pair of socks in their PE bag to change into from tights.

DRESSING-UP DAYS AND NON-SCHOOL UNIFORM DAYS IN SCHOOL

From time to time, we have dressing-up days and non-school uniform days in school.

On dressing-up days such as Purim or book-character dress-up days, girls may wear **long** trousers as part of their outfits. We always ask that children are dressed in an age-appropriate manner and in keeping with the ethos of the school. If you are in any doubt, please ask us in advance. We thank you very much for your assistance with this.

Non-school uniform days are when children may be asked to come wearing something specific to school (such as blue and white clothing for Yom Ha'atzmaut; green, brown and pink clothing for Tu B'Shvat etc). On these days girls wear skirts or dresses as they do on a normal school day.

Boys & girls should always wear clothes with sleeves on non-school uniform and dress-up days (short or long sleeves but no sleeveless or cap sleeves) & not wear crop tops.
